An Encouraging Word...

A Date Which Will Live in Infamy

Dec. 7th, 1941 the nation of Japan attacked Pearl Harbor, ushering the USA into World War II. This day signaled a change in America. No longer could they avoid the war. Now they had been attacked, and they needed to respond. This date would live in infamy because of the attack on American soil, but also because it signaled the beginning of the war for most Americans. Things had changed, and not for the better.

586 B.C. the city of Jerusalem fell, including the majestic temple of Jerusalem. Babylon had done the unthinkable and conquered God's people. In the words of the psalmist, remembering the event and the subsequent exile, "By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. There on the poplars we hung our harps, for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said, 'Sing us one of the songs of Zion!' How can we sing the songs of the LORD while in a foreign land?"

It's hard to sing when we are mourning. It's hard to sing when the world doesn't seem *right*. I know this has been a difficult year for many and being unable to meet in person is difficult for us all. Yet God has not abandoned us. Amid a prophecy about the fall of Jerusalem, known at the book of Lamentations, one of the darkest and saddest books of the Bible, we find, at the very center, words of great hope in times of crisis: "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. I say to myself, 'The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for him." (La 3:22–24).
